THREE TUNES: by CARL BARON

Here are a few tabs in different tunings for the Old-Time picker:

The rests in "Monkey In A Dog Cart" go by rather quickly. The spaces can be handled by either "frailing air" as described in BNL, Vol. III, No. 9, p. 12 or by syncopating the motion of the right hand. On the opening 3-8 slide, both 3 and 8 should be struck (the slide is for effect with both the starting and ending notes played). Another unusual feature is the syncopation in the 4th and 12th measures of the first part. The 5th string is actually struck in its normal time position, but the space

preceeding it might make it feel awkward, at first, to play.

In "**Liberty Off Of The Corn Likker Still**", the fingering indicated makes playing those sections much easier.

If people are having any difficulties with these or other tabs of mine (not other people's) published in BNL, I would be happy to put them on a cassette tape.
