A bugle only uses four notes pitched in the key of C. These notes are the 1 3 5 of the key so a C chord is all that is needed to play backup.

On the banjo, accordingly, these 4 notes can be played at capo 5th, all open.

(The highest note is either the first string open or the fifth string open, notice, no capo just open G)

BTW these are great practice drills for learning to read different rhythms!
